



WARZONE: ATLANTA 2018 SPORTSMANSHIP RUBRIC

Each round, you will submit a Sportsmanship Rubric scoresheet for your opponent. The scoresheet has four areas (described below), each of which you must mark as “Acceptable” or “Unacceptable.”

“Yes” means that your opponent has met (or exceeded) the minimum standards to uphold the social contract needed to have a fair and enjoyable tournament game of Warhammer 40k. They don’t have to be perfect.

“No” means that your opponent did something unacceptable or otherwise outside of the norms. Usually, a Judge will follow up and investigate to ensure that this has been marked fairly.

Each round a player may earn up to 3 POINTS from the Sportsmanship Rubric. Any “No” marks reduce this by 1, to a minimum of zero. Players who consistently receive “No” marks may be subject to additional penalties, including, but not limited to, being removed from the event.

TIME

- **My opponent was at the table ready to start when the round timer started.**
- **My opponent fairly split the time allotted for the round.**

KNOWLEDGE

- **My opponent had a reasonable command of the Warhammer 40k Rules.**
- **My opponent had a reasonable command of the specific rules for the army they brought to the event.**
- **My opponent had a reasonable understanding of the mission being played.**

ATTITUDE

- **My opponent communicated clearly throughout the game.**
- **My opponent played in a friendly yet competitive manner.**
- **My opponent addressed any rules disputes fairly.**

PREPARED

- **My opponent brought all of the things necessary to play a tournament game of Warhammer 40k (e.g., dice, tape measure, codex(es), FAQs, counters, etc.).**
- **My opponent provided me with a printed copy of their army list.**
